MCT is the nation's largest touring children's theater group and has been touring for more than 30 years. The MCT team of actors/directors will arrive in Louisville at the end of this month. They come fully equipped with a set, lights, costumes, props and make-up; all they need is a cast! The show will cast 50-60 local students from 1st to 12<sup>th</sup> grade! The show is rehearsed throughout the week, and two public performances are presented on Saturday. The performances will take place at Manhattan Middle School in Boulder. Tickets are \$6 for adults, \$5 for seniors and \$3 for students. All seating is general admission and tickets will only be sold at the door. Hope to see you all there!

Finally, I must say too, that I was very



impressed with the maturity of **Tanner Kaler's** and **Donny Brown's** performances. They nailed it every time."

On Golden Pond played the last two weeks of April. It was a joy to see the many talents of the above actors come together to produce an amazing show. CCCT thanks all of you who came to see this great production and thanks to the cast and crew for all your hard work. This means that the success and overall livelihood of our organization relies on people like you who generously donate their time and efforts to our theater. Some of you may be wondering how you can participate or become more involved. Below are just some of the positions that we are seeking volunteers for:

## **Board Members (starting January 2007)**

Required Time: About 5-15 hours a month, more during shows Play an integral role in guiding the company to success.

#### **Ushers**

Required Time: At least one performance

Greet patrons and show them to their seats. Will be able to see the show for free on the night you usher.

#### **Box Office**

Required Time: At least one performance Greet patrons, sell tickets, assign seats, and sell concessions. Will be

able to see the show for free on the night you work.

#### **Opening Night Reception**

Required Time: Opening night performance

Coordinate with the Opening Night Reception Committee and cast to provide food, refreshments and decorations for a reception after the opening night performance.

#### **Original Script Reviewers**

Required Time: 2-5 hours per month Read original scripts submitted to CCCT and analyze the dramatic quality of the piece.

#### <u>Lighting/Sound Designers and</u> Technicians

Required Time: Entire run of show Designers - Requires experience and skill in lighting and/or sound design. Technicians - Experience operating a sound/light board desired, but not required.

#### Set Building and Painting

Required Time: As much as you like during tech weekend Help build and paint various set pieces.

#### **Development Coordinators**

Required Time: 1-10 hours per month depending on need Help write grants, arrange for food donations for tech. weekend, secure silent auction items etc.
